Why recommend Windhoek? A Windhoek start creates a clean south-to-north circuit. Starting in Walvis Bay would normally involve travelling inland to Sossusvlei and then retracing the route to the coast before continuing north. Windhoek is therefore our recommendation, not a requirement.

Route at a glance

Windhoek → Sossusvlei and Deadvlei → Swakopmund → Cape Cross and the Skeleton Coast → Twyfelfontein and the Huab Valley → Ongava and Etosha → Windhoek

DAY 1

Windhoek to Sossusvlei

Approx. 375 km | 5½–6½ hours plus stops

Dead Valley Lodge | Tented chalet | Full board

Meet your Namvic driver-guide in Windhoek and travel southwest through the Khomas Highlands into the Namib. The scenery changes from mountain passes and open farmland to the pale plains around Sesriem. Staying inside the park gate positions you well for the following morning. The departure time is confirmed around your arrival arrangements and Namvic's operating hours.

DAY 2

Sossusvlei and Deadvlei, then Swakopmund

Approx. 350 km | 5½–6½ hours after the dune visit

Start before sunrise for cooler temperatures and beautiful light, then explore the dune corridor, Sossusvlei and Deadvlei. Continue via Solitaire and the Gaub and Kuiseb landscapes to the Atlantic coast. This is an active highlights day rather than a leisurely transfer. Dinner is at your own expense, allowing you to choose from Swakopmund's restaurants.

DAY 3

Swakopmund, Cape Cross and Damaraland

Approx. 425 km | 6–7 hours plus the seal-colony visit

Follow the coast north and visit the Cape Cross seal colony, known for its extraordinary concentration of Cape fur seals. Continue briefly through the Skeleton Coast landscape before turning inland toward Twyfelfontein, granite outcrops and the dry river systems of Damaraland.

DAY 4

Desert-adapted wildlife in the Huab Valley

Local shared excursion day

Join a shared lodge excursion into the Huab River system to search for desert-adapted elephants and other wildlife. Sightings are never guaranteed, but the tracking, geology and survival stories of this arid landscape make the day rewarding. If timing permits, Twyfelfontein's rock engravings or nearby geological sites can also be visited.

DAY 5

Damaraland to Ongava, Etosha's southern gateway

Approx. 340 km | 5–6 hours

Ongava Lodge | Double chalet | Full board

Travel east and north through Damaraland toward Etosha. Settle into Ongava Lodge on its private reserve, where a productive waterhole can be watched from the deck. Depending on arrival time, enjoy a first late-afternoon game-viewing session with your Namvic guide.

DAY 6

Private Etosha game-viewing day

Flexible game-drive circuit

Ongava Lodge | Double chalet | Full board

Explore Etosha National Park in the private Namvic safari vehicle. The route responds to recent sightings, road conditions and waterhole activity, allowing time for patient viewing rather than rushing between stops. Return to Ongava for dinner and further waterhole watching. Lodge-operated activities can be added subject to availability and price confirmation.

DAY 7

Ongava to Windhoek or Windhoek Airport

Approx. 435 km | 4½–5½ hours plus stops

Breakfast included | No overnight accommodation

After breakfast, travel south through central Namibia to Windhoek or the international airport. This is a substantial transfer day. For an airport finish, a sufficiently late departure is required; Namvic confirms the safe routing once the flight time is known.

What the guide price is designed to include

- Private Namvic 4x4 and professional driver-guide for the proposed route.
- Six nights' accommodation for two adults sharing, using the example properties and stated meal bases.
- Fuel for the proposed route, drinking water in the safari vehicle, and the listed core park/site visits.
- Sossusvlei and Deadvlei, Cape Cross, a shared Huab Valley nature excursion, and privately guided Etosha game viewing.
- Windhoek airport transfers within the confirmed itinerary and operating arrangements.

Important planning notes

- This is a reusable route idea, not a confirmed departure. No lodge, vehicle, guide or activity is held until Namvic confirms availability in writing.
- The guide price is based on two adults sharing and is recalculated for the requested dates, traveller count, rooming, accommodation level and supplier rates.
- Flights, travel insurance, drinks, personal expenses and services not confirmed in the final proposal are excluded.
- Days 2, 3 and 7 are substantial. A slower journey requires at least one additional night.
- Wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed, and daily sequencing can change with weather, road conditions, park rules and operational requirements.
- Please provide arrival and departure details and dietary requirements when requesting the itinerary.
